

General Information

The Northern Alberta Senior Amateur (NASA) Ladies Golf Tour is open to any amateur lady golfer 50 years of age or older. We are affiliated with the NASA Men's

League and closely follow the men's format and rules. We are indebted to them for their assistance in negotiating excellent rates with the courses that we will play.

Eighteen hole tournaments are held on Mondays (Tuesday if Monday is a holiday) at various courses in and around the Edmonton area from May to September. No handicaps are required.

NASA's Motto is GOOD GOLF & GOOD FELLOWSHIP

- 1) Tee times are booked online and can be booked starting twelve days prior to the tournament on the Wednesday at 7:00 pm or 7:00 Thursday twelve days prior to Tuesday tournaments. E.g. Bookings for the first 2015 season tournament on May 16, 2015 will begin at 7:00 on Wednesday, May 4.
- 2) Each player is permitted to register a maximum of four players. That is herself and three other players.
- 3) **Power carts** must be booked by the individual player with the course pro shop, unless the power cart is included in the entry fee.
- 4) To cancel a tee time, notify the Tournament Coordinator as soon as possible. On tournament mornings contact the host pro shop to cancel and ask that person to inform the registration person in the clubhouse of your cancellation. If you are unable to play YOU MUST CANCEL. Failing to cancel will result in a No Show.

If you find you have to cancel you can either call the tournament coordinator or send her an email at <u>NASA.Ladies@gmail.com</u>. If you must cancel after **6 PM** on Sunday please send an email to the tournament coordinator **and** contact the pro shop.

- 5) The Tournament Coordinator will not accept phone calls prior to 9 AM or after 9 PM. Calls after 6 PM on Sunday will **not** be acknowledged.
- 6) Names of No Shows will appear in **bold print** on the tournament results sheet. A second **NO SHOW** will result in a one month suspension.
- 7) If in doubt about inclement weather, contact the host pro shop. A number of the games are out of town and the weather at the course can be very different from the weather in town. If the pro shop says the weather there is fine, believe them.
- 8) Most tournaments will be played using the crossover* format. A maximum of 128 players can be accommodated in the crossover. Any additional players will be given a tee time following the crossover. If there are fewer than 90 players registered for a tournament, the tee times may be converted to straight tee times and the players will be advised of their new tee time.

The opening game on May 16, the game at The Legends on July 25, the game at Leduc on September 6 and the windup on September 12 will have shotgun starts.

* In a crossover, players begin play in both the front (hole 1) and back nine (hole 10) and then move to the other nine. That is, two sets of players start at the same time.

9) At the conclusion of each tournament, gross scores will be ranked from lowest to highest. Ties are broken utilizing a count back system. Flights of ten are established, with prizes awarded as follows:

- **11**) The windup tournament on September 12 will be a Texas Scramble with a shotgun start. The registration form for the windup will be available in June. There will be a post-season game on September 19 at Sturgeon Valley. Scores from that game will not be recorded.
